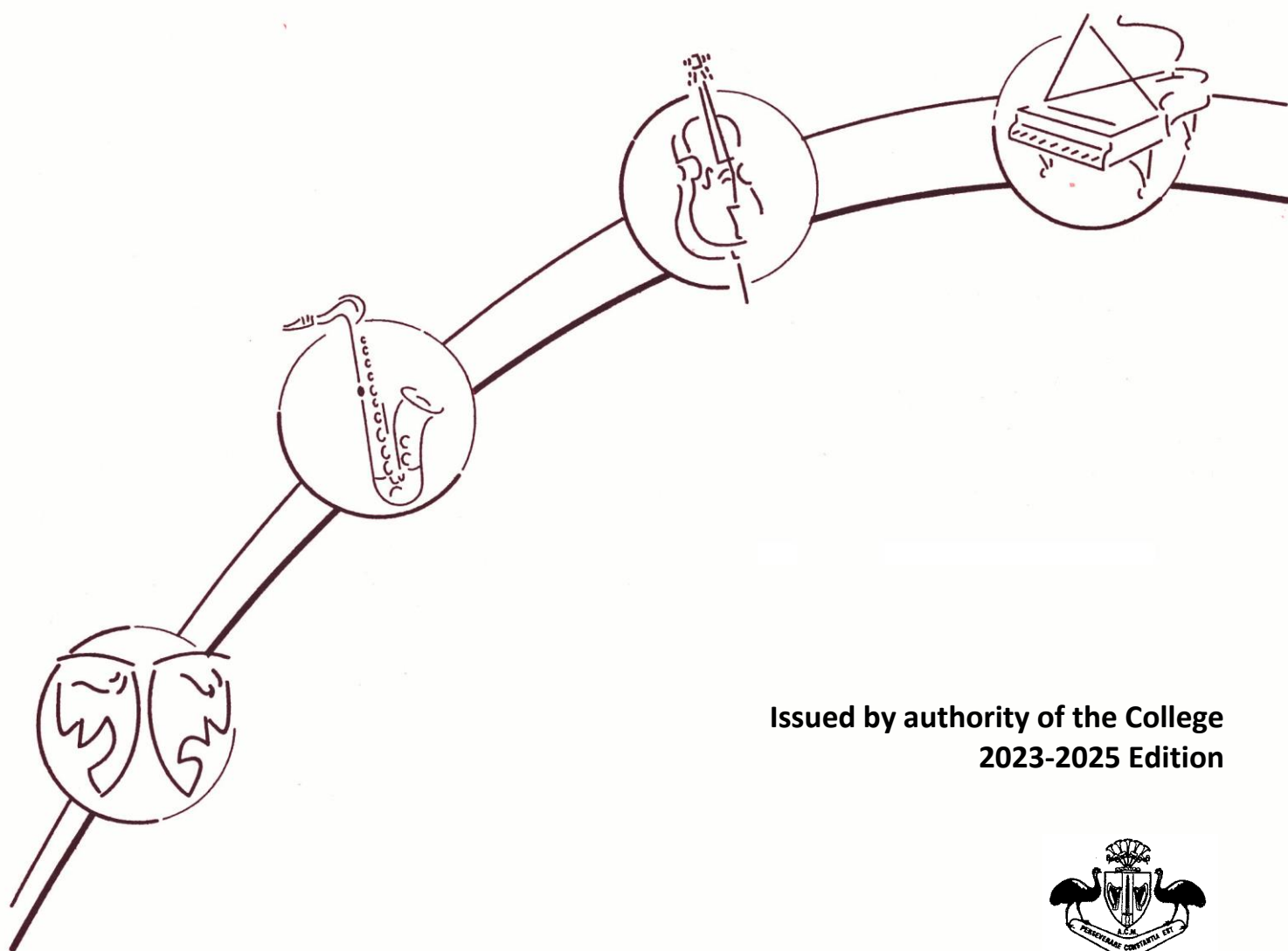

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PIANO IN A MODERN STYLE

The aim of this syllabus is to provide a structured series of exams in a more modern style of music. This will allow students who prefer this form to have an exam base and a structured series of work. Australian content will be emphasized where possible.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL GRADES

Three pieces required to be performed. One to be selected from each group.

LIST A

Own choice. This piece will be written with the tune in the treble staff with chord symbols provided. Students will be able to add the bass using the chord symbols. It is expected that as the grades advance, students will be able to use more varied and complicated bass accompaniments based on the chords or the accompaniments provided. It is the standard of performance, and the level of technical skill showing an understanding of the musical concept of the harmonic bass, that will be examined in this section. Choice of this piece can be taken from popular music sources, musicals, Christmas Carols, folk tunes or nursery rhymes. Own choice should be made according to the level of the grade. Repeats may be played if improvisation is used.

LIST B

This piece should have artistic merit, with emphasis on style, form and expression. This piece is selected to allow the student to show technical ability and musical performance for the grade level. Repeats are not played.

LIST C

Own choice. This is to be your own choice of a recognised Australian Composer. The piece should be of a standard comparable for this grade. Repeats are not played.

PLEASE NOTE

Other pieces of your choice can be substituted for the List B pieces. They must conform to the guide lines and be of a suitable standard for this grade. A copy of the substitute piece should accompany the entry form with a brief summary of the reasons for your choice.

AURAL TESTS OR SIGHT READING

Students will be able to choose to do aural tests **or** sight reading in their exam. The aural tests are shown at the end of each grade list. Sight reading will be in keeping with the relevant standard for the grade. For Grade One only hands separately will be required. For Grade Two, a simple melody in the right hand with chord symbols given for the left hand in the primary chord position, will be given. Similar sight reading of increasing complexity, will be given for further grades.

CHORDS AND ARPEGGIOS

For each grade, chords of the scale keys should be known. These include the primary chords for the grade as listed. The progression for the chords are as follows - Tonic (root), sub dominant (2nd inversion), tonic (root), dominant 7th (1st inversion), tonic (root), or 1, IV, I, V7, 1.

Own choice Australian Composition from a recognised Australian Composer. The piece chosen should have technical value, and be of a similar standard to other Grade 1 pieces.

GENERAL KNOWLEDGE

Questions based on the music played.

Knowledge of clefs, notes, time values and signatures, signs, any words and their meanings, expression marks and key signatures will be tested.

AURAL TESTS (OR SIGHT READING)

Clap a rhythm suitable to this grade.

Identify the higher or lower of two notes played within an octave.

Sing the notes in the C major triad after the key note has been sounded.

Be able to beat 2/4 time to a tune in this time played by the examiner.

Identify the major or minor chord.

GRADE II

TECHNICAL WORK

Scales - As shown on Scale Chart for grade 2

Chords / Arpeggios - As shown on Chord Chart for grade 2

PIECES - Three required, one from each of List A, B, and C.

List A

Own choice. - Chosen according to the guidelines set out in REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL GRADES. It is expected that for this grade there should be other chords included, as well as the primary chords, be at least 16 bars long and have musical merit. - Some suggestions.

GENERAL KNOWLEDGE

Knowledge of clefs, notes, time values and signatures, expression marks, signs, any words and their meanings and key signatures will be tested.

AURAL TESTS (OR SIGHT READING)

Clap a rhythm suitable for this level.

Sing the notes of the C major chord after the key note has been played.

Be able to beat 3/4 time to a tune in this time, played by the examiner.

Identify a major or minor chord.

Sing the tonic at the end of a short passage.

GRADE III

TECHNICAL WORK

Scales - As shown on the scale chart for Grade 3

Chords / Arpeggios - As shown on the chord/arpeggio chart for grade 3

PIECES - Three pieces required, one from each List A, B and C.

List A

Own Choice - Piece chosen according to the guidelines as set out in the REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL GRADES. It is expected that for this grade there should be modulation away from the original key and the left hand accompaniment shows variation from the basic full chord arrangement. This may be written in the music or improvised by the student. - Some Suggestions

Own choice Australian composition from a recognised Australian composer. The piece chosen should have technical value and be of a similar standard to other Grade 3 pieces.

GENERAL KNOWLEDGE

Knowledge of clefs, notes, time values and signatures, expression marks, signs, any words and their meanings and key signatures will be tested. Form and style of piece will also be tested.

AURAL TESTS (OR SIGHT READING)

Clap a rhythm suitable for this level.

Recognise a major or minor triad as played by the examiner.

Sing the notes of a major or minor triad beginning on a given note.

Identify the intervals of a major 3rd, a perfect 5th or 8th.

Be able to beat in 2/4, 3/4 or 4/4 time to a tune played by the examiner.

GRADE IV

TECHNICAL WORK

Scales - As shown on Scale Chart for Grade 4

Chords / Arpeggios - As shown on Chord Chart for Grade 4

PIECES - Three required, one from each of List A, B, and C.

List A

Own choice. - Chosen according to the guidelines set out in REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL GRADES. It is expected that for this grade there should be modulation away from the main key and a more involved accompaniment for the left hand showing variations of style. The piece should also be of a reasonable length for this grade, but not done by continuous repetition of sections. Some suggestions – pieces from: Popular music albums, guitar albums, popular group and individual entertainer albums, or sheet music, any Busking Collection

Own choice Australian composition from a recognised Australian composer. The piece chosen should have technical value and be of a similar standard to other Grade 4 pieces.

GENERAL KNOWLEDGE

Knowledge of clefs, notes, time values and signatures, expression marks, signs, any words and their meanings and key signatures will be tested. Form and style of piece will also be tested, as well as a knowledge of the history of the type of music represented.

AURAL TESTS (OR SIGHT READING)

Clap a rhythm suitable to this grade.

Identify the time signature of a short piece in 3/4, 4/4, or 6/8 time.

Sing the middle note of a major triad as played in the root position.

Identify the intervals of a major 2nd and 3rd and perfect 4th and 5th.

Identify if a triad is in root position or an inversion.

GRADE V

TECHNICAL WORK

Scales - As shown on Scale Chart for Grade 5

Chords / Arpeggios - As shown on Chord Chart for Grade 5

Pieces - Three required, one from each of List A, B, and C.

List A

Own choice. - Chosen according to the guidelines set out in REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL GRADES. It is expected that for this grade there should be modulation away from the main key and an involved accompaniment for the left hand showing variations of style. The piece should also be of a reasonable length for this grade, but not done by continuous repetition of sections. It may include improvisation by the student.

GENERAL KNOWLEDGE

Knowledge of clefs, notes, time values and signatures, expression marks, signs, any words and their meanings and key signatures will be tested. Form and style of piece will also be tested, as well as a knowledge of the history of the type of music represented.

AURAL TESTS (OR SIGHT READING)

Clap a rhythm suitable for this grade

Name any interval in the major scale as played by the examiner.

Identify the position of a triad in root, 1st or 2nd inversions.

Be able to sing all three notes, ascending or descending, of a major or minor triad in root position or inversions, as played by the examiner.

GRADE VI

TECHNICAL WORK

Scales - As shown on Scale Chart for Grade 6

Chords / Arpeggios - As shown on Chord Chart for Grade 6

PIECES - Three required, one from each of List A, B, and C.

List A

Own choice. Chosen according to the guidelines set out in REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL GRADES. It is expected that for this grade there should be modulation away from the main key and an involved accompaniment for the left hand showing variations of style. The piece should also be of a reasonable length for this grade, but not done by continuous repetition of sections. It may include improvisation by the student.

GENERAL KNOWLEDGE

Knowledge of clefs, notes, time values and signatures, expression marks, signs, any words and their meanings and key signatures will be tested. Form and style of piece will also be tested, as well as a knowledge of the history of the type of music represented.

AURAL TESTS (OR SIGHT READING)

Clap a rhythm suitable for this grade

Name any interval in the major scale.

Identify if a piece is in 2/4, 3/4, 4/4, 5/4, 6/8, or 9/8 time

Be able to sing the middle note of a major or minor triad in root position or inversions, as played by the examiner.
